Ann Langley has been working in health policy at the federal level since 1977, includes work at the Department of Health and Human Services, the U.S. Senate, and government relations firms. Ms. Langley's experience with health care legislation and programs covers a broad range, from Medicare and Medicaid to public health and biomedical research

Ms. Langley is currently the Senior Counsel for Public Policy for the National Association of Children's Hospitals, assisting in the development and implementation of the Association's federal agenda and representing its efforts on behalf of its member hospitals before the Executive Branch and Congress.

During her time at the Senate, Ms. Langley served as senior health staff on the Senate Special Committee on Aging and covered Finance Committee health issues for Senator John Heinz (R-PA). Prior to that, she worked in the Offices of the Assistant Secretary for Health and the Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation in the Carter Administration.

Ms. Langley began her career as a physical therapist, working at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston, Massachusetts and at Methodist Hospital in Houston, Texas. She obtained a Masters Degree in Health Administration and Education from a joint program of the University of Houston and Baylor College of Medicine, and taught at the Texas Medical Center campus of Texas Woman's University prior to moving to Washington, D.C.
