W. Carl Cooley, MD, is a developmental pediatrician and adjunct associate professor of pediatrics at the Dartmouth Medical School. Dr. Cooley was formerly the Director of the Center for Genetics and Child Development at DHMC. He is the medical director of the Crotched Mountain Foundation and the Crotched Mountain Rehabilitation Center in Greenfield, NH where he is also medical director of the Center for Medical Home Improvement. His clinical interests include Down syndrome, autism spectrum disorders, and neuromotor disabilities. Dr. Cooley's research interests focus on the redesign of primary care delivery systems in keeping with the medical home model. He is co-author of Preventive Management for Children with Genetic Conditions – Providing a Primary Care Medical Home 2<sup>nd</sup> Edition (2006). He was named NH Pediatrician of the Year in 2001 and in 2006 received the first annual Calvin J. Sia Community Pediatrics Medical Home Leadership and Advocacy award from the American Academy of Pediatrics and the Director's Award from the United States Maternal and Child Health Bureau.
