Leonard G. Feld, MD, PhD, MMM, FAAP, is the Sara H. Bissell & Howard C. Bissell Endowed Chair in Pediatrics and Chief Medical Officer at the Levine Children's Hospital at Carolinas Medical Center, and Clinical Professor of Pediatrics at UNC School of Medicine

Prior to joining the Carolinas Healthcare System, Dr. Feld was chairman of pediatrics for the Atlantic Health System and physician-in-chief of the Goryeb Children's Hospital in New Jersey from 1997 to 2006. He was also Professor of Pediatrics at UMDNJ-New Jersey Medical School. Prior to 1997, he served as Chief of Pediatric Nephrology in the Department of Pediatrics at Children's Hospital in Buffalo, vice chairman of pediatrics and professor of pediatrics at the State University of New York at the Buffalo School of Medicine.

Dr. Feld has extensively published articles, monographs/chapters, books, and abstracts. He is co-editor of the textbook - Fast Facts in Pediatrics and is co-editor-in-chief of Consensus in Pediatrics. In preparation is a new textbook - Handbook of Fluid and Electrolytes in Pediatrics to be published by Human Press (Springer). He also serves on the editorial board of Pediatrics in Review (American Academy of Pediatrics).

He has organized national and regional CME courses in general pediatrics and nephrology. Dr. Feld has also planned leadership courses for his faculty in Financial Management, and Communications. In addition he designed the Pediatric Board Review Course held in Metropolitan New York/New Jersey and in Charlotte. He is also co-editor of Pediatric Quality for Pediatric Clinics in North America (August 2009). He is also co-chair of the Medical Education Committee for the American Society of Pediatric Nephrology. For the past two years, he has served on the US NEWS and WORLD REPORT - Special Working Group to Develop Criteria for Children's Hospitals.



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
