Dr. Oyeku is a general pediatrician and health services researcher. She is an Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine at Yeshiva University. She joined the faculty at the Children's Hospital at Montefiore in August 2006. Dr. Oyeku's clinical activities are focused on providing pediatric primary care within the Family Care Center at Montefiore Medical Center. She also patients in the Pediatric Sickle Cell Program at the Children's Hospital at Montefiore. Dr. Oyeku's research interests include quality of care for children with chronic diseases such as sickle cell disease and racial and ethnic disparities in health care.

Prior to joining the Children's Hospital at Montefiore, Dr. Oyeku was a health services researcher within the Division of General Pediatrics at Children's Hospital Boston. In addition, she was an attending physician in the Primary Care Center and Sickle Cell Program at Children's Hospital Boston and an Instructor in Pediatrics at Harvard Medical School.

Dr. Oyeku completed her pediatric residency training at the Boston Combined Residency Program in Pediatrics at Children's Hospital Boston and Boston Medical Center. Dr. Oyeku also completed fellowship training in the Harvard Pediatric Health Services Research Fellowship program at Children's Hospital Boston. She received her Master's degree in Public Health at the Harvard School of Public Health.

Dr. Oyeku is a member of the Strategy and Policy Advisory Council for the National Initiative for Children's Healthcare Quality. Dr. Oyeku was a recipient of the Dean's Award for Community Service from Harvard Medical School. She is also a member of several professional societies including the American Academy of Pediatrics, Academic Pediatrics Association, and Massachusetts Society of Medicine
