Dr. Weissman directed the pediatric primary care faculty group practice and training programs based at the George Washington University Medical Center from 1978-1995. Dr. Weissman has been an actively practicing primary care pediatrician in Washington, D.C. for 30 years- recognized by *Washingtonian Magazine* & *Washington Consumer Checkbook*. He is certified by the American Board of Pediatrics, a Fellow of the American Academy of Pediatrics and a member of the American College of Healthcare Executives. Dr. Weissman serves as the American Academy of Pediatrics DC Chapter Liaison for the AAP's Section on Administration and Practice Management and its' Council on Clinical Information Technology (COCIT).
