Criterion for NICHQ Award for Outstanding Faculty Achievement

NICHQ understands that it is only through the efforts of our faculty that devote hours of time to our projects that NICHQ has been able to positively impact so many systems. The award recognizes individuals who have gone above and beyond the call of duty to provide service, support and intellectual capital to partnerships on a regional or national level that substantially improved quality healthcare for children in the United States.

Award Criteria

The award recipient should be an individual who has provided substantial support and technical assistance to NICHQ, its partners and networks for parents of children with special healthcare needs. Nominees must have made a significant contribution to improving the quality and safety of healthcare for children through the creation, implementation or evaluation of a program and/or series of projects substantially improve the quality of children's healthcare.

The NICHQ Award for Outstanding Faculty Achievement recognizes individuals whose work demonstrates the following characteristics:

- Multidisciplinary
- Fostering collaborative efforts
- Focused on community
- Promoting equity in care and outcomes
- Systems oriented
- Family Centered

The collective work of the award recipient should contribute towards the development of a health system that is safe, effective, patient-centered, timely, efficient, and equitable for all patients and populations, particularly children.

Nomination Process

Nominators should send a letter of nomination to NICHQ Award Selection Committee by email at forum@nichq.org. This letter should indicate the nominee's name, current and relevant previous organizational affiliations and positions as well as

relevant indicators of national leadership (e.g., committee or leadership positions). The letter should describe the nominee's accomplishments in improving children's healthcare, and how these accomplishments demonstrate the characteristics described above. The contact information for two personal references of the nominee should also be provided.

Self nominations are invited.

The award will be presented at NICHQ's Annual Forum for Improving Children's Healthcare and Childhood Obesity Congress at the Hyatt Regency Atlanta on Peachtree Street in Atlanta, Georgia. The forum will be held March 8-11, 2010.

The Award

The award consists of an elegant original sculpture with the individual's name inscribed in the base. The award presentation will be held on Tuesday evening, March 9, 2010. In addition to the award, the recipient will receive complementary registration to attend the forum, travel and accommodations. Additional details will be provided at a later date.
