Carol Siegel, M.D., M.S.P.H., has worked as a general pediatrician in a community health setting since 1987. She attended medical school at Duke University, and graduated with an M.D. in 1982. Postgraduate work included a residency in Pediatrics, completed in 1986, and a Masters of Science in Public Health, in 1995, at the University of Colorado School of Medicine. She completed an HRST Faculty Development Fellowship between 1993 and 1995 in the Department of Medicine at the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center, Denver, Colorado.

Dr. Siegel began her career in community health in July of 1987 at the Westside Health Center of Denver Health and Hospitals, Denver, Colorado. She served as Director of Pediatrics at the Eastside Health Center, Denver, Colorado from 1990 until 1993. In July of 1995, she joined the staff at Clinica Family Health Services in Denver, Colorado, where she currently works as a general pediatrician. Clinica FHS is a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) serving 40,000 underserved patients in the metro Denver area. Her clinical interests include the care of special needs children, pediatric developmental screening, immunization delivery, and ADHD. She has been involved in the development of a planned care delivery model for both ADHD and asthma, and the improvement of immunization delivery services at Clinica.



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
